## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

1

The University of Maryland football team will play its second straight Big Ten road game on Saturday when it travels to West Lafayette, Indiana for the first time ever to take on Purdue. The game will kick at noon and be broadcast on BTN and the Maryland Sports Radio Network.

5

Against Rutgers, RB **Javon Leake** returned the opening kickoff of the second half 100 yards for his second career kick return touchdown, marking the first time any Big Ten team has returned a kick to the house this season. With a WR **DJ Turner** punt return touchdown in Week One vs. Howard, Maryland is one of only five FBS teams with both a kick return and punt return touchdown this season, joining Appalachian State, Houston, UCLA and Utah State. Maryland leads the Big Ten in both kick return average (29.44 ypr) and punt return average (15.13 ypr).

RB **Anthony McFarland Jr.** has tallied seven rushing touchdowns through five games this season (2 vs. Howard, 2 vs. Syracuse, 1 at Temple, 2 at Rutgers), the ninth highest total in the country and the most for a Maryland RB in the first five games of the season since Keon Lattimore also had seven in 2007.

The Maryland defense has tallied 16 sacks through four games, the 19th highest total in the country and the Terrapins most over a five-game span since Maryland finished the year with 18 (1 at Michigan, 2 vs. Ohio State, 3 at Nebraska, 7 vs. Rutgers, 5 vs. Boston College) in 2016. LB **Keandre Jones** has 4.5 to lead the Terps, the sixth highest total in the Big Ten and 20th best in the country.

17

Maryland has forced a turnover in 17 straight contests, the third-longest streak in the FBS, trailing only Mississippi State (21) and Syracuse (19). The Terps, who notched a takeaway in every game last season continued the streak last week at Rutgers when they picked off the Scarlet Knights twice, first by LB **Ayinde Eley** and then by LB **Isaiah Davis**, his first career interception. The Terps have forced nine turnovers and only lost five, a plus-four margin this season, the 21st best in the country and top five in the Big Ten. Maryland won the turnover battle in four of the first five games.

30

Senior DB **Antoine Brooks Jr.** has totaled 30 solo tackles this year, the most per game in the Big Ten and the 15th highest total in the country. Brooks has led Maryland in tackles in three of the five games and tallied a career-best 13, all solo, at Temple (9/14).

40

All three of the Terps wins this season have been by at least 40 points (79 vs. Howard, 43 vs. Syracuse, 41 at Rutgers), making Maryland one of only three teams in the country (Ohio State and Wisconsin) to have three 40-plus point wins. It is the first time since 1974 that Maryland has had three 40-plus point wins in a single season.

207

Maryland has 207 points through five games, the highest total in the first five games of a season in program history and the most over any five game span since scoring 223 during a five game win streak in the 2002 season. The Terps 41.4 points per game is the 14th highest in the country and fourth-most in the Big Ten.

## ON THE OFFENSE

## By The Numbers

1

TE **Tyler Mabry** caught a touchdown pass in each of the first three games of the season, the first Maryland tight end to do so since Vernon Davis in 2005 (at North Carolina, #23 Boston College, at NC State) and the first time any player has done so since WR DJ Moore in the first three games of 2017 (at #23 Texas, Towson, UCF).

3

The Terps scored on three straight offensive plays in the second quarter against Rutgers, (**Tayon Fleet-Davis** 23 yard reception; **Javon Leake** 42 yard rush; **Anthony McFarland Jr.** 2 yard rush) in a 2:50 span, the fastest Maryland has done so since scoring three touchdowns in 34 seconds against North Carolina on November 24, 2012.

7

Big Play Offense: Maryland has **seven** touchdowns of 40-plus yards this season after tallying four last weekend at Rutgers. Those seven big play touchdowns are the third most in the Big Ten, only trailing Nebraska (13) and Ohio State (9). The Terps two 80-yard touchdowns against Rutgers were the first time Maryland has had two 80-plus yard touchdowns in the same game since at least 1977.

Maryland currently has **eight** student-athletes who have earned an undergraduate degree, the 20th highest total among power-five teams. OL **Sean Christie**, LB **Isaiah Davis**, RB **Jake Funk**, QB **Josh Jackson**, DL **Brett Kulka**, TE **Tyler Mabry**, OL **Ellis McKennie** and LB **Shaq Smith**. All **eight** are pursuing a graduate degree.

10

QB **Josh Jackson** has thrown **10** touchdowns over the first four games of the season, while throwing for 968 yards, the most touchdowns thrown by any Maryland quarterback through the first five games of the season since Scott Milanovich threw 16 in 1993.

This past weekend at Rutgers, RB **Anthony McFarland Jr.** tallied his 10th and 11th touchdowns of his career, becoming the quickest Maryland running back to reach 11 touchdowns (193 carries) since D.J. Adams scored 11 times on just 67 carries in 2010. Last season, McFarland broke the Maryland freshman rushing record with 1,034 yards and has five 100-yard rushing games through the first 17 of his career.

142

Maryland's **142** points in the first two games of the season (79 - Howard, 63 - #21 Syracuse) were the most by a Big Ten team since 1936 (Ohio State, 1996) and the third most by any FBS team over that span, trailing only Ole Miss' 149 in 2015 and Florida's 143 in 1994. The 142 points were the most through any two successive games in Maryland history, surpassing the previous mark of 122 (1954 vs. George Washington 48-6 and Missouri 74-13).

2,561

The powerful Maryland running back corps has three tailbacks who have combined for **2,561** yards thus far in their careers. Led by **Anthony McFarland Jr.** who has starred thus far in his career with 1,370 yards, **Javon Leake (670)** and **Tayon-Fleet Davis (521)** have all contributed to the powerful Maryland rushing attack.

## ON THE DEFENSE/ST

## By The Numbers

2

RB **Javon Leake** has now returned **two** kick returns for a touchdown in his career (97 yards vs. Illinois; 10/27/18 & 100 yards vs. Rutgers; 10/5/19), tied for the **second** most in Maryland history. This week, Leake also tied former Terps Ty Johnson and Will Likely for the most Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors with **two**. The junior has accumulated 898 return yards in his career, the 13th most in Maryland history.

4

Maryland has **four** transfers listed as starters on the team's current two-deep, two on defense and two on offense. On defense: linebackers **Keandre Jones** and **Shaq Smith** enter the fold, both coming from top programs, Jones from Ohio State and Smith fresh off a national championship at Clemson. On offense: the Terps starting quarterback **Josh Jackson** comes from Virginia Tech, where he set countless freshman program records in 2017 and the Terps starting tight end **Tyler Mabry** comes from the Buffalo where he earned 2018 First Team All-Mid American Conference honors. Jones and Smith each posted a sack and combined for seven tackles in their Maryland debut last week, while Jones tallied seven tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble last week vs. #21 Syracuse.

LB **Keandre Jones** is tied for the 20th-most sacks in the country with **4.5** through four games. Jones, who has tallied a tackle for loss in all five games this season, had a career-high two sacks vs. #21 Syracuse, one in each half, to pair with his forced fumble. Jones's 0.90 sacks per game ranks third in the Big Ten.

10

Maryland recorded 10 tackles for loss last week at Rutgers, the Terps most since tallying 12 vs. Rutgers on November 26, 2016. Nine Terps tackled Rutgers in the backfield, led by a career-best three from DL **Bryce Brand**.

17

The Terps have forced a turnover in **17** straight games, the third longest streak in the country, trailing only Mississippi State (21) and Syracuse (19). Maryland has forced nine turnovers this season, five interceptions and four fumbles and has a plus-four turnover margin.

17

S Darnell Savage Jr. was drafted 21st overall by the Green Bay Packers in the NFL Draft this past April, making him the **17th** player in program history to be selected in the first round. Maryland has now had first round draft picks in **back-to-back** years for the first time since 2005-06 (Shawne Merriman (2005) and Vernon Davis (2006)). WR DJ Moore was the first wide receiver off the board in 2017 at No. 24 overall, and Savage was the first safety off the board in 2018 at No. 21.

31.2

Maryland has been strong defensively on third down this season, holding opponents to just 24-of-77 on third down (31.2%), the 23rd best rate in the country. Opponents have been held under 40-percent on third down in all but one game this season. In addition, Maryland is just one of four teams in the country (North Carolina, FIU, Kansas State) to not allow a fourth down conversion this season.

68

The Terps held Howard to just **68** yards of offense in Week One, the lowest total by a Maryland opponent since at least 1977 and the lowest total offense mark by any team throughout the country in Week One. The Bison ran for only one yard, also the lowest total by a Terrapin opponent since at least 1977 and tied Syracuse for the third lowest total allowed throughout the country, trailing only Michigan State and Syracuse.
